Over the past year or so Scott has mentioned wanting to purchase a sauna. I thought he was being very irrational at first! I continued to ignore his comments about wanting one because I thought why would anyone need a sauna in their home. In my mind I thought these were the types of things you would go to a health club or gym to use. I thought it would take up way too much space and clutter our home. He mentioned at one point that we could use it as our prayer room or what some people call a war room. Then I remembered I bought him a prayer mat last Christmas he asked for and he never used it! And that was a cheap purchase. There was no way I could agree to make such an investment on something that may never be used.

That prayer room comment stuck in my head for months. God was tugging at my heart to meet Scott in the middle on this one. Not only for our marriage or our health (since saunas are said to be so good for you) but for our spiritual health.

We both have been reading the marriage Monday's from ECMen. We discuss them together weekly and we both knew we had some work to do in our marriage. The thought of making such a big purchase at first sounded selfish to me, but I felt God telling me this sauna was going to be used for His good and for His Glory. The investment was for Him not ourselves.

Scott uses the sauna with the worship music playing or he listens to sermons. He has been able to grow in his relationship with Christ by spending more time with Our Father. For me, I made it a personal goal to never take a device or phone inside when I go in. I use this 20–35 minutes to reflect on my faith and spend time with the Lord. We both do not regret this decision because we are benefiting in so many ways.

What we have learned though and wanted to share with others, is meeting your spouses needs sometimes means compromising or making sacrifices. Let God take it from there. He will work in your marriage if you let Him and are open to hearing Him and His voice.

The Marriage Monday's has opened up so many conversations for us in our marriage. And it has helped us communicate about things we used to ignore. We took a chance by getting this sauna but now see this was not done just for the goal to lose weight or get healthy. It has been a blessing in disguise as we both have been using it for spiritual growth. Our teenage son even loves using it!

Thank you Matt & Amy for being vulnerable and opening up your marriage to help serve others. We have seen God move so many mountains recently in our home. We are grateful and joyful for so many things we could not see before. God can and will do wonders if you listen for His voice in all things.
